You can visit the shops in any order, but be sure to match the correct letters to the corresponding numbers!

Want an extra challenge? See if you can spot these historic places while exploring Bakewell!

- **Bakewell Bridge** – This famous stone bridge is very old! It was built more than **700 years ago** in the **1300s**. See if you can count how many arches it has as you hop across!
- **Ducks on the Wye River** – Once you've found the bridge, look down and you'll see the river flowing underneath! The River Wye is one of the **longest rivers in the UK** and is home to **LOTS** of ducks. If you'd like to feed them, you can find duck food in some shops around town (look out for signs!). Can you spot a mallard with a shiny green head?
- **All Saints Church** – This beautiful church is even older than the bridge! It has two ancient stone crosses from the **800s (that's over 1,100 years ago!)**. Look up high to spot its tall spire. You can see it from lots of places around Bakewell.

DID YOU KNOW?

- **Bunnies are amazing athletes**, they can jump as high as 90 centimetres in one leap!
- **Bunnies have very long ears** and they can grow up to 10 centimetres long! These special ears can turn around almost all the way (about 180 degrees!)
- **Bunnies can sleep with their eyes** open to stay alert
- **Bunnies are social animals**, thriving in groups called colonies or fluffles. They communicate through body language, thumping their hind legs to signal danger, purring when content, and performing a joyful leap called a binky when happy.
- **Bunnies teeth never stop growing!** Instead, they're gradually worn down as the rabbit chews on grasses, wildflowers and vegetables, meaning they never get too long!

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The Easter Bunny is on the loose, and he's hiding in images all around Bakewell!

Grab your Easter Trail Map and head to the businesses listed on the other side. Keep your eyes peeled for bunny posters in their windows!

Inside each bunny image, you'll spot an egg containing a hidden letter. Write it above the matching number on your worksheet to solve the riddle on the right. Take your time and check out the sights and shops along the trail; we know they'd be *hoppy* to see you!

Once you've collected all the letters and solved the riddle, head back to

The Old Original Bakewell Pudding Shop to claim your prize: a bunny biscuit* straight from **The Bakewell Bakery**.
